On October 26, 2000, Ken passed away. Those of us privileged enough to know him will always treasure the memory of his advice, guidance and friendship.

The Kline Family has a long history of serving the community through its affiliation with Alpha Phi Omega. Dr. Ernest Kline, a Chemistry Professor at UCONN from 1929 to 1971, was a Charter Advisor to the chapter at its inception in 1947 and served until his retirement. His son Kenneth (B.S. 1956) became a Brother in 1952, serving the chapter as President and subsequently Advisor from 1961-1997. Dr. Nancy Mattoon Kline, Kenneth's wife and a UCONN librarian from 1968-1997, became an Honorary Brother of Alpha Phi Omega in 1984.
